The Housing Authority is committed to operating in an efficient, ethical, and professional manner. The Housing Authority will create and maintain partnerships with its clients and appropriate community agencies in order to accomplish this mission.

Remodeling Project

Tyler Terrace community had bathrooms completely remodeled in 32 units. This project began November 2, 2020 and was completed March 26, 2021. Remodeling consisted of new sheetrock, flooring, sink, commode, lights/exhaust fan, faucets and tub/shower combo. Residents were temporally housed at a local hotel while their unit was remodeled.

The remodel cost for all 32 units totaled \$505,772.00

The Housing Authority provides all new residents a Welcome Bag with household items that are useful during the moving process. This year the Housing Authority distributed over applications. JHA worked tirelessly achieving the goal of housing low income and homeless individuals by providing housing for17 families which consisted of 40 members while adding 5 other eligible families to the waiting list.
